

Talks selection process

PHP Serbia is a community organized conference, and as such, the organizers care very much about the opinions of the community. This reflects in the way that talks are selected for each conference. The process for talks selections has three phases: Community selected talks, Program committee team selections and the final selection by the organizers.

1. Community selected talks

Process of selecting talks for PHP Serbia conference begins with Community selected talks. We open Call or Papers every year for all registered users (people who buy the conference ticket) for the Community selected talks, where the community, who are delegates who have bought the ticket for that years conference, gets to pick their favourite talks.

All delegates who buy a ticket for the conference up until the date when the Call for Papers closes are eligible to participate in the Community selected talks.

Community selected talks phase ends with closing of the Call for Papers.

2. Program committee team selections

Members of Program committee team are some of the most influential PHP developers from all over the world, and include some of previous years' speakers.

The Program committee team will go through all talk submissions and, based on the results of the Community selected talks, choose the talks they consider to be the best to be held at the conference.

Program committee team selection lasts up to 30 days.

3. Organizer's final selection

Organizers will, according to the Community selected talks and the selection by the Program committee team make the final selection of the talks for the conference.

All speakers, unrelated if their talks have or have not been chosen to be held at the conference, will receive an email from the organizers, informing them if their talks have been selected.

Organizers will make the final selections within a week after the Program committee team selections.

Organizers keep the right to publish information about selected talks prior to closing of the Call for Papers or ending of the Talks selection process.
